Curious? Could the O.T. possibly stand for 'Oklahoma Territory'? YES! These bricks are known as Chandler bricks, as they were manufactured in Chandler, a centrally located Oklahoma town opened by a land run in 1891. This brick dates to before 1907 when Oklahoma became a state.

But what is a century old brick doing at Oakcreek? To find the answer we need to ask our builder, Scott Campbell. Scott was extremely involved with our construction. With his grandfather's help, he bought the final Oakcreek home that allowed the community to get a building loan from the bank. That's dedication.




Medical Services

These facilities are serviced by over 150 physicians and advanced care practitioners which represent more than 40 specialties. There is an urgent care facility less than 1 mile from Oakcreek; the hospital is less than 3 miles away.



Near the city of Pawhuska, you'll find bison, prairie vegatation, and the cabin of John Joseph Mathews, one of Oklahoma's formost naturalists.





• John Joseph Mathews:

He was an Osage scientist, naturalist, hunter, veteran, artist and historian who lived a life devoted to honoring his heritage and the Tallgrass prairie.

The cabin:

Built in 1932, Mathews built his one-room sandstone cabin on his ancestral land where he wrote many of his works.

Preservation:

The Nature Conservancy of Oklahoma purchased the property in 2014 and added it to the Tallgrass Prairie Preserve for preservation.

Interesting Skies
